Linux proves to be more secure, and more efficient in its use of computing resources than most proprietary operating systems. A variety of open source and proprietary programs run on Linux, giving users a rich multimedia experience. A wide range of computers based on Intel chips, including systems considered "obsolete" by Microsoft, support Linux. This sustainability slows the rapid accumulation of e-waste - and being free of cost, Linux is knocking down barriers of entry for people and businesses around the world.

Linux encourages growth in the average computer user. The transparency of open operating systems and applications permits users control of their system and to work with communities to help tools evolve. Learning to program is encouraged, and access to
